About HKUMed

Since 1887

The Medical Faculty of The University of Hong Kong is the most historic local tertiary education institution, and the third oldest medical school in the country. It was founded as the Hong Kong College of Medicine for Chinese by the London Missionary Society in 1887, and later renamed the Hong Kong College of Medicine in 1907. The Faculty was accorded the position of premier Faculty when the University opened in 1912.

Serving Hong Kong for 131 years, the Faculty is not only an institution of learning, innovation, and enterprising; but also a school of morals, vision, and care. The Faculty and its predecessor have been playing a pioneering role in medical education, training and research since our establishment.

From our modest beginnings, the Faculty has now become the largest faculty of the University, with 400 full-time professoriate staff, 800 research personnel and 2,000 honorary teachers. There are approximately 2,900 undergraduate and 1,500 postgraduate students. The Faculty comprises 4 schools, 14 departments, 3 paedagogical units and more than 30 research centres, institutes and technology platforms focusing on various strengths of teaching and research of the Faculty.



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For 130 years the Faculty has been leading the advancement of health care in Hong Kong, the region and beyond. As we turn the page towards the next 130 years of service and discovery, it is an opportune time to reflect on the essence of our incredible journey.

For its 130th Anniversary, the Faculty is celebrating the core values that we inherited from our forebears and that still guide our mission: wisdom, compassion and commitment. The “130 for 130” Legacy Campaign is not only a meaningful way to honour that legacy and give back to the alma mater, but also to help students coming through the ranks to embrace these timeless virtues, just as our past legacy has contributed to.


